Taverham Hall Preparatory School is justifiably proud of its established academic reputation. The high standards achieved by our pupils are recognised by both Senior Schools and inspection teams.

Scholarships to Senior Schools:

- A number of Year 8 pupils were offered a range of scholarships to their choice of Senior School for a September 2014 start. One pupil was offered 3 Scholarship options to 3 different Senior Schools.
- Since 1921 Academic, Music, Art, Sport and All Rounder Scholarships have been consistently awarded by Senior Schools to Taverham Hall School pupils. Pupils have gained scholarships to Senior Schools such as Oundle, Rugby, Radley, Harrow, Uppingham, Winchester, The Leys, Oakham and St John's and also to local Senior Schools such as Norwich School, Gresham's, Framlingham, Culford and Langley.
- Taverham Hall School offer their own scholarships to children of outstanding ability. These are awarded for music, sport, academia and in exceptional circumstances, an all-rounder, which encompasses all of the aforementioned. Applications can be submitted from Year 3 and at 11+.

PRE-PREP DEPARTMENT

Reading, Spelling, Maths and English Assessments

This year the Pre-Prep Department have fallen in line with the Prep School and introduced NFER English and Maths testing along with reading and spelling ages.

The results have proved to be excellent with;

97% of Year 2 pupils achieving above national average grades for Reading

87% of Year 2 pupils achieving above national average grades for English

74% of Year 2 pupils achieving above national average grades for Maths.

Pupils are heard to read individually every day in Taverham Hall's Pre-Prep department which helps them to develop their reading skills and love of reading at a very early age.

Awards/Accolades for the school:

The school's most recent ISI inspections undertaken in June 2014 confirmed that the school meets all National Minimum Standards for Boarding Schools and, once again, rated the overall provision of the EYFS at Taverham Hall as outstanding which complements the three outstanding inspection reports

undertaken in 2010 and 2011 as well as the Healthy Schools Award, demonstrating the importance Taverham Hall places on emotional health and well being. Taverham Hall's holistic education is further enhanced through its Forest School lessons which provide pupils with an outdoor resource across the curriculum and freedom to explore the 100 acres of the school's beautiful wooded parkland. This unique learning environment has been enhanced this year by the building of a wonderful outdoor classroom. The educational focus remains firmly on the individual with a continued commitment to small class sizes. A body of inspiring and dedicated staff, together with the breadth of opportunities on offer makes Taverham Hall Preparatory School exceptional.

- **ISI Inspection report – 2014 – EYFS outstanding in all areas** (meeting the needs of the range of children that attend; provision for the children's well-being; leadership & management; the overall quality and standards) **and Boarding National Minimum Standards compliance in all areas.** *“The children's personal and social development is excellent. They enjoy their learning.” “Boarders report that they are extremely happy with their boarding experience.”*
- **Best School Food Project – 2013** at the Norfolk Food & Drink Awards 2013 – Best School Food Project – Taverham Hall Preparatory School was listed as 1 of the 4 finalists and received a Highly Commended Certificate
- **Healthy Schools Award - March 2012**
To qualify for National Healthy School status Taverham Hall were required to meet criteria in four core themes. These criteria relate not only to the taught curriculum but also to the emotional, physical and learning environment that the school provides and include personal, social and health education, healthy eating, physical activity and emotional health and wellbeing.
- **OCN Forest School Leader Award** – (since 2009) - a number of Taverham Hall School staff are qualified to deliver Forest School teaching to the highest standard by Forest School practitioners – level 3 of OCN Forest School Leader Award. *“The surrounding parkland is a paradise for pupils.” “The curriculum is significantly enhanced by sessions in the Forest School.”* – ISI November 2010. Forest School originates from Scandinavia and offers children the opportunity to spend time in the great outdoors and participate in a wide range of activities with a wealth of cross-curricular links. National Curriculum subjects are reinforced and supported by practical, hands-on learning. Science, geography, art and drama are just some of the subjects continued outside the classroom. Carefully planned and supervised activities allow children to take managed risks and make choices appropriate to their age and ability. Learning follows ‘enquiry through exploration’ principles. Forest School encourages children to learn and develop socially, physically and emotionally. It boosts their self esteem, confidence and ability to work with others and allows children the opportunity to make choices for themselves.
- **2010/2011 - Outstanding - Ofsted** - In May 2011 Ofsted inspected the school's social care and boarding environment which was rated ‘**outstanding**’: *‘Pupils are provided with an excellent level of care and pastoral support. They are cared for by staff who know them well; their views are sought and they feel listened to. The school provides pupils with a safe and nurturing environment and an extensive programme of activities that contributes to their social and self-help skills.’*
- **November 2010 – ISI inspection** - in their November 2010 inspection report Taverham Hall School was described as providing ‘**an excellent all-round education. The well-planned, wide-ranging and stimulating curriculum enables all pupils to reach high standards in relation to their age and ability.**’ Additionally, *‘There is an excellent success rate in Common Entrance examinations and Year 8 leavers consistently obtain places in their first choice of senior school, several with scholarships.’*

The ISI also rated the **Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)** at Taverham Hall School as ‘**outstanding**’ in all of the following areas:

1. the overall effectiveness of the EYFS
2. the effectiveness of the leadership and management of the EYFS
3. the quality of the provision in the EYFS
4. the outcomes for the children in the EYFS

*‘The overall effectiveness and quality of the Early Years provision is **outstanding**. Children make significant progress in their learning and development.’* Furthermore, *‘Children's work and interests are valued and reflected well in the colourful and stimulating learning environment.*

Outdoor provision is exceptionally good for both nursery and reception children, who participate enthusiastically in the Forest School activities in all weather conditions.’ **‘Children are happy, self-motivated and enjoy learning.’**

- **2009/2010 - Outstanding - Ofsted** - In January 2010 Taverham Hall School's Nursery was inspected and the overall effectiveness of the Early Years provision at Taverham Hall School was rated as '**outstanding**'.
- **Green Tree School** - Taverham Hall School has achieved the Silver standard on the Green Tree Award Scheme of the Woodland Trust.
- **Centre of Excellence of Norfolk Youth Cricket** - Taverham Hall School's Sports Hall facility is the Centre of Excellence for Norfolk Youth Cricket. In addition the sports hall is used as the home venue for the National Premier League Thoroughbreds netball team.

Highlights of the 2013-2014 academic year:

ENGLISH

- Haileybury creative writing competition 3 pupils were successful with their entries and awarded prizes.
- A Year 8 pupil came runner up in this year's Royal Norfolk Show's Poetry Competition.

- Taverham Hall School's Quiz Team won the quarter finals of the East Anglian Junior Schools' Challenge winning by 580 points to 120 of their opposing team.
- Two pupils entered the on-line tutorial based critical reading course provided by OLP Oxford which aims to deepen understanding of key themes, promote critical thinking and analysis and develop intellectual confidence.
- Second edition of Taverham Hall's 'We are writers' creative writing book was produced which includes work from Prep School pupils across the year groups.
- Taverham Hall School runs an annual Spelling Bee competition for all prep school pupils.
- Debating was introduced as a new hobby.

MATHS

- Taverham Hall finished 8th out of 20 schools in the regional round of the UKMT team maths challenge 2014. (In 2013 Taverham Hall won the Regional Finals and was 1 of 80 schools who qualified for the national UKMT finals).
- The UK Mathematics Trust Junior Mathematical Challenge 2014. Over 240,000 pupils from across the UK sat the Junior Maths Challenge with roughly the top 6% receiving a gold certificate, the next 13% silver and the next 21% bronze.

14 pupils received the following medals: 4 Gold, 4 Silver and 6 Bronze levels

The Junior Challenge 2014 thresholds were:

Bronze 50 Silver 63 Gold 79 Olympiad Qualifier 108

MUSIC/DRAMA

- A total of 30 music assemblies took place featuring original compositions, class work and solos. Approximately 90% of pupils received instrumental lessons at the school or were involved in one of the 10 extra-curricular music activities offered at the school. 20 pupils took practical ABRSM music exams and maintained the school's record of a 100% pass rate, with over 50% gaining merit and distinction awards.
- Prep school pupils performed in a Pantomime production called 'Cinderella'.
- Pre-Prep children performed in a Christmas nativity production called 'Mother Christmas' Journey' whilst Nursery 2 children acted out their own Christmas nativity play.
- Pre-Prep children sang songs from the musical Joseph in a performance to parents (July).
- A Year 4 pupil was selected to perform at the Theatre Royal in Norwich in the pantomime 'Cinderella' which ran from December 2013 to January 2014.
- A Year 8 pupil took part in the Britten Centenary Concert at Snape in November, with Norwich Cathedral Choir. The Choir performed Britten's Spring Symphony and this was broadcast live on BBC Radio 3, conducted by Oliver Knussen. Prior to the live broadcast this pupil went to the BBC Maida Vale studios in London for a rehearsal.
- Seven members of Taverham Hall's Chapel Choir travelled to Earsham Primary School in November as part of the Chapel Choir's Outreach Project. They worked with Year 3 and 4 children at Earsham to learn two songs for their Christmas Concert - Calypso Carol and A New Boy Born.
- Taverham Hall's Chapel Choir performed at North Elmham Church (June).
- In 2011 the school's Choir qualified for the finals of the Barnardo's Choir of the Year competition and a Year 8 pupil was selected for the National Youth Choir that same year.

ART

- A Year 3 and Year 5 pupil were both crowned winners of the Norfolk Show Art competition in their respective year groups (May).
- A Year 7 pupil had her artwork published in the Satips national Prep School's Annual Art Exhibition booklet (May).
- A Year 3 pupil won 3rd place in a Christmas card design competition run by the British Horseracing & Education Standards Trust.

DT

- Pupils took part in the local annual Rotary Club Technology Competition in March.
- Pupils took part in a DT Activity Day at Felsted.
- Year 7 pupils took part in a C3 Engineering Trip in the Summer term.

SPORT

PRE-PREP

In the Pre-Prep department pupils have been offered Fencing, Tennis, Ballet and Ukulele as new hobbies this year as well as their usual activities of Choir, Recorders, Football, Tag Rugby, Arts and Crafts and contemporary Dance. Next year we plan to add Cheer Leading, Computing, Maths and Netball as further activity choices. The Pre-Prep children continue to work towards the national accredited ASA Scheme in their swimming lessons and have weekly lessons from a specialist teacher in the school pool. They also receive weekly PE lessons and all take part in the annual Pre-Prep sports day.

PREP SCHOOL

The school has represented Norfolk successfully in sport this academic year. Four school teams have made the national finals in both the girls' and boys' hockey, soccer and cricket. In addition, individual national representations were made in athletics, rugby, swimming, tennis and karate.

- A Year 6 pupil qualified for the National IAPS **swimming** finals and finished in 6th place in the 50 metres freestyle. A Year 5 pupil finished 23rd out of 127 entrants in the regional IAPS swimming trials.
- A Year 6 pupil won 12 medals in the National County Swimming Championships having swum in excess of 3,000 metres in total.
- Pupils received top level Hockey and Rugby **coaching** from a two time Olympian and ex South African Hockey captain and an Elite Level 5 Rugby Coach/Head Coach of the England Students.
- Two Year 6 pupils and two Year 8 pupils were selected for the first stage of the U11 and U13 East and West Midlands Barbarian Prep School's **Rugby** Club Squad. In November both Year 8 pupils and one of the Year 6 pupils progressed to the Midlands Prep Schools Rugby Squad in the U13 and U11 groups respectively for whom they competed in March. One of the Year 8 pupils was selected after this for the U13 Independent Schools National rugby side and toured Ireland with this team over the Easter holiday period.
- The U11A girls were crowned winners at the Thetford **Netball** Tournament (October) whilst the U11B/C team won the plate competition of the Norwich School Netball Tournament (March).
- The U12 girls entered the IAPS Regional **Hockey** Tournament and reached the semi-finals after finishing second in their group. They then went on to represent the school in the IAPS National Finals (November) and narrowly missed out on the plate competition.
- The U9B boys' hockey team were crowned winners of an annual hockey tournament at a local independent school. The U9A team finished in 2nd place in that same tournament (March).
- The U11 boys won the Norfolk In2Hockey County Championships (January) and as a result represented Norfolk in the Regional In2Hockey finals (March) which they also won and were crowned 2013-2014 champions.
- The U11 boys' hockey team finished in 2nd place in the IAPS East Regional finals (February) and went through to the IAPS National finals held at Wellington College (March) where they finished 11th nationally out of a total of 20 teams.
- The U13 boys' hockey team finished in 3rd place in the Norfolk In2Hockey County Championships (January) and were crowned IAPS East Region Plate Winners in the IAPS Regional Hockey Tournament (March).
- Three Year 7 and one Year 8 pupil were selected by the Norfolk Junior Academy where they train for the U13 County Hockey Team (January 2014).
- Taverham Hall's U11A rounders team finished in second position in an annual Suffolk **rounders** tournament (May).
- Taverham Hall's U12 rounders team finished in 3rd position in the Norwich Area U13 Rounders Tournament (June).
- Taverham Hall's U11 **Cricket** team were crowned County Cup Champions as well as winners of the East of England Regional U11 ESCA Hardball Final and as a result qualified for the National Finals held at Oakham School (July) where they finished in 3rd position.

- Taverham Hall's U11 cricket team won the Gresham's Cricket Festival (June) and finished in 3rd position at Framlingham College Cricket Festival.
- Taverham Hall's U13 cricket team finished runners up in the County Cup finals (July).
- Taverham Hall's U9A cricket team remained unbeaten all season.
- Pupils received a specialist top level coaching session (March) with a visit from Northants' middle order batsman, Rob Newton. With him was 2nd XI Coach at Northamptonshire CCC, Phil Rowe, who has been instrumental in Northants success in gaining promotion to Division 1 of the County Championship and in their emphatic 20:20.
- Each year a number of Taverham Hall pupils are selected to play for the Norfolk County Cricket Squad. This year a further nine pupils have been selected; two for the U10s, two for the U11s, two for the U12s and two for the U13s county cricket groups.
- In October 2012 one of the school's U13 pupils gained an early place on their Emerging Players Programme. In 2012 the U11 cricket team won the East of England Hardball Finals at Chigwell School in Essex. They also represented the East of England in the English Schools' Cricket Association Finals at Oakham School in July that year and finished in 4th position. In July 2011 the Colts A team were crowned County Cup winners whilst in 2010 the U12 cricket team were crowned County Champions.
- Taverham Hall's **Cross Country** teams won bronze, silver and gold medals in a local annual tournament (January). The Year 5 girls' team won a bronze medal and the Year 6 boys' team won the team shield and gold medals for their performances. In addition, a number of individual bronze and silver medals were won by Year 3 and Year 6 girls and a Year 6 boy.
- Taverham Hall's U11 **Table Tennis** team finished in 2nd place at the ESTTA (Eastern Schools Table Tennis Association) Table Tennis competition (January) and qualified for the national ESTTA finals in Blackburn (March). The U13 team reached the semi-finals of the regional stages, having been crowned county champions previously.
- Two Year 8 girls and two Year 7 boys qualified to represent the West Norwich & Dereham Schools Sports Partnership Table Tennis team for the Norfolk School Games Finals in table tennis. The event took place at the UEA Sportspark in March. The girls' team finished in 2nd place whilst the boys' team won the tournament.
- A Year 7 pupil ranked 6th nationally in the 12U girls' **tennis** age group; 1st in Norfolk, 1st in East Anglia. She won the following tournaments: the Norwich Open Clay Court Championships 2014 for Girls 18 & Under; the Norwich Open 12 & Under Clay Court Championships 2014; the 14 & Under Girls Norwich Open Clay Court Championships 2014; the Cambridge 12U Summer Open 2014; the Framlingham Lawn Tennis Tournament and Suffolk U12 Championships 2014; the Felixstowe Summer Championships as well as winning both the 12U and 14U Norfolk Junior Closed Championship 2014. She also qualified to play in the Summer National Final at Bournemouth.
- Taverham Hall School won 2 regional **football** tournaments (for the third year in a row) during the Autumn term: 1st places for the boys' U9 and U11 teams (winners of two tournaments). In addition Taverham Hall's U11 girls/boys team were crowned winners of the FA Schools Football Cup 2014 held in January and competed again in March where the team finished in 5th place in the finals.
- The U11 boys' football team were also crowned ISFA Regional Champions and went through to the National Finals which took place in the Summer term at St George's Park where they finished in 4th position nationally.
- Norwich City FC Academy - a Year 6 pupil is closely monitored by this Premiership Football Club. He was graded as an 'A' grade player by Norwich City Academy in March 2013 and was selected to represent Norwich City Academy's side at an international tournament in Latvia.
- Pupils have qualified for the national finals at the **Prep School's Athletics Tournament in Birmingham** for the past 9 years. This year another pupil qualified after competing at the **East Area Prep Schools Athletics Championships in Bedford** for the U14 discus events. At the nationals this pupil won a bronze medal. In July 2013 a Year 8 pupil won a bronze medal at the National Athletics finals held in Birmingham for the U14 discus event. The previous year (July 2012) a Year 8 pupil won a silver medal at the same finals for the U14 girls' discus event completing a hat-trick of medals (winning a silver medal and a gold medal in the two previous years for the same event).

- At a local Athletics meet in May Taverham Hall pupils secured 1st, 2nd and 3rd places in a number of the events.
- **UEA 2014 Athletics Championships** 1st places were achieved in the U11 and U10 cricket ball, U10 75m, U11 100m and U10 relay (boys); 1st U11 200m (girls); 2nd places in U10 (girls) and U11 (boys) long jump and U10 100m (boys) and 3rd places in U11 100m (girls), U11 cricket ball and U10 long jump (boys) and U10 hurdles (boys).
- Taverham Hall competed in the School's **Show Jumping Competition** at the prestigious Houghton Hall international horse trials. The girls' team finished in 1st place and the boys' team finished in 2nd place winning gold and silver medals.
- A Year 8 pupil won the first round of the U14 Mud, Sweat and Gears **mountain bike** competition at the beginning of March and a Year 3 finished in second position in the U9 group. Due to further success this Year 8 pupil is now leading the Eastern Region Youth Series.
- At the Norfolk Inter-schools **Coarse Angling Championships** organized by West Norfolk & Dereham School Partnership at Barford Lakes (May). Taverham Hall's A-team finished runners up overall. Every other school in the competition was a secondary school with competitors aged up to 17.
- A Year 6 pupil was selected for the TSKUK (**Karate**) National Championships in Hatfield (April) representing his club ESKA and won a bronze medal in the Team Kumite event.
- **Skiing** –after taking part at the The Norfolk Winter Games in December two pupils qualified to represent the Dereham and West Norfolk Partnership Year 7, 8 and 9 Ski Team at the Norfolk Schools Partnerships Finals held in the New Year. One pupil won an individual silver medal in addition to the team's bronze medal with the other pupil in this event.
- **Ballet:** A Year 7 pupil secured a role in the English Youth Ballet's production of Swan Lake which was performed at Norwich's Theatre Royal in March 2014. This is a fantastic achievement given that 230 young dancers auditioned for only 80 parts.

LANGUAGES

- Languages, each year Year 7 pupils enter the National French Linguatrivia competition whilst pupils who are under 11 years of age are all given the opportunity to enter the annual national Junior Language Challenge competition organised by Eurotalk. Taverham Hall School pupils have entered this competition for the past 7 years - learning the basics of languages such as Italian, Spanish, Japanese, Chichewa, Portuguese, Kazakh, Greek, Korean, Dutch etc. through a number of on-line games. Each year pupils have qualified for the regional finals held in Cambridge and in 3 out of the 7 years pupils took part in the ultimate final in London.
- Six pupils qualified for the semi-final of the Eurotalk Junior Language Challenge having learned Italian. They now have to learn Japanese over the summer holiday period to play 'live' against other semi-finalists in the region in September 2014.
- Russian, German, Chinese and Japanese Language Workshops took place this academic year as part of the school's Language Awareness programme.
- A Celebration of Languages and Multiculturalism Day took place in June where a carousel of language workshops was offered to pupils.

Why choose Taverham Hall School?

Taverham Hall Preparatory School is justifiably proud of its established academic reputation. The school offers an exceptional education in an idyllic 100 acres woodland location with excellent facilities for its pupils. A dedication to provide outstanding pastoral care combined with personalised, academic learning programmes, small classes and investigative hands-on Forest School experiences in the unique woodland environment ensure that any child, whether sporty, creative or academic who values space and freedom to develop, is motivated and thrives at Taverham Hall School.

Taverham Hall School offers a focus on *how* children learn rather than *what* they learn. The school's teaching staff identify learning styles, set personalised targets and tailor teaching to the individual,

ensuring that each child has every opportunity to achieve their personal best. Through individual academic guidance and a carefully thought out PSHE program, pupils are encouraged to analyse their strengths and target their weaknesses.

Specialist teachers throughout the school ensure children flourish in the school's vibrant, warm and friendly atmosphere which ensures pupils are heard to read every day in our Pre-Prep department. High pupil achievements contribute to the school's excellent record for placing Year 8 pupils at various Senior Schools as well as obtaining Senior School scholarships each year. Pupils emerge from their final years as well-mannered, confident, friendly and interesting young people well equipped for the challenges that lie ahead.

As pupils approach Common Entrance and Scholarship examinations, there is a greater move towards independence. Pupils take increased responsibility for their learning and conduct, as well as obtaining leadership roles within the school, including Prefect status and mentoring younger (Year 3) pupils when in Year 8 – MATES programme (Mentoring at Taverham Everyone Succeeds). Both the School's Council and Boarders' Forum provide pupils with a voice and an opportunity to play an active role in the school's community as well as enhancing ways in which pupils can communicate with staff and the school in general. In their top two years pupils are taught life skills which culminates in an exciting post Common Entrance programme with a clear focus on fun, adventure and team work.

Form Tutors play a key role and weekly drop-in clinics for parents strengthen communication between home and school. In addition, parents can contribute their views via the school's Parents' Forum Group.

Is there anything else you should know about?

- Interactive white boards - all classrooms throughout the Pre-Prep and Prep school are furnished with interactive white boards ensuring pupils are able to use the latest technology during their lessons.
- **River Wensum and unique outdoor facilities**
Taverham Hall has fishing rights for the River Wensum, which runs through the school's 100 acre grounds. Pupils from Year 3 onwards have the unique opportunity to take up the hobbies of fishing and canoeing during the summer term. In addition, there are pupil gardens and chickens for the children to care for and learn about management and preservation. Roped swing areas including a zip-wire enhance the outdoor opportunities for the school's pupils.
- **90th Jubilee**
Taverham Hall School celebrated its official 90th Jubilee Celebration Day as a Preparatory school on 19th June 2012. The school invited pupils between the ages of 7 -13 from all Norfolk based schools, to enter their Creative Writing and Art Competition. A superb panel of judges (Stephen Fry, Kirsty Riddiford, David Miller, Brian Lewis, Lucy Loveheart and Peter Kavanagh) examined the entries and selected the winners.
